Opening for Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Buffalo

The Graduate School of Education at the University at Buffalo-SUNY is seeking a full-time faculty member with expertise in School Counseling for a position as a Clinical Assistant Professor beginning in Fall 2012. The position is a 10-month appointment with a recurring 3-year contract.

Qualified applicants will have (1) an earned master's degree in School Counseling; (2) doctorate or ABD in counseling or a related field; (3) experience as a school counselor. The individual hired will be expected to teach four courses per semester, such as: Introduction to School Counseling, Career Development, Practicum and Internship in School Counseling, Consultation, Organization and Administration of Guidance Systems, and electives relevant to school counselors.

Alberti Center for Bullying Abuse Prevention releases Quarterly Newsletter


