For instance, I led a two-year Teaching and Learning Enhancement Project that was a land-based experiential learning opportunity for Indigenous pre-service teachers in rural communities of north-central BC, Canada, to engage in traditional Indigenous storytelling practices in digital teaching and learning contexts. ## (i) Pedagogical Innovation

I am involved in program and course development, including formal curriculum changes. I re-designed Educational Psychology and Special Education teacher education courses to support blended learning. This blended learning approach combined holistic pedagogies and online practices, which attend to Indigenous knowledges in online and land-based learning environments. I designed digital contexts for teaching and learning for rural community-based undergraduate students. In addition, I have been involved in adapting course sequence in the professional certification year of the Indigenous Teacher Education Program to better serve community contexts at regional Field Centres. I am a co-applicant on creating open educational resources for the Human Development, Learning and Culture course redevelopment, which is a mandatory course in the teacher education program.

#### (j) Innovation in the use of learning technology

Digital storytelling is an educational tool that gives space, voice, and agency to Indigenous people. Digital storytelling allows for creative expressions of Indigenous storied traditions through audio, video, and multimodal narrations to uphold oral traditions. I mentored Indigenous pre-service teachers to create open educational resources in the *Grease Trail Digital Storytelling Project*. Digital storytelling was utilized to enhance the preservation and accessibility of Indigenous histories, stories, and memories embedded in the land. Indigenous digital storytelling was guided by the Indigenous Four Rs framework of respect, relevance, responsibility, and reciprocity. The digital storytelling project *respected* local Indigenous knowledges to expand Indigenous-focused digital learning resources. The digital storytelling project developed *relevant* digital storytelling as an instructional tool to enhance teaching and learning. For responsibility, the project provided land-based learning opportunities for pre-service Indigenous teachers. For reciprocity, the project created open Indigenous digital storytelling resources to be used in schools and Indigenous communities.

#### (k) Other teacher educational leadership contributions

Learners are at the center of my teaching process. My teaching expertise focuses on human development, assessment, and place-based learning. For culturally revitalizing teaching practices, I host Talking Circles with leaners and invite Knowledge Keepers, including Elders, Storytellers, Indigenous Principals, Aboriginal Resource Teachers, Indigenous Language Teachers, and Scholars. As the Cariboo Field Centre Coordinator for UBC's NITEP – Indigenous Teacher Education Program, I worked in partnership with School District #27 (Cariboo – Chilcotin), School District #28 (Quesnel), Tsilhqot'in National Government, Thompson Rivers University-Williams Lake, and University of Northern BC South Central Campus.

The 2020/21 was an unprecedent year due to a global pandemic. In response public health orders, I worked with Teacher Education Office, NITEP Office, faculty, and community partners to develop an online synchronous schedule for BEd professional certification program tailored to the Cariboo cohort. I co-developed a two-week online summer Orientation program for continuing and new Indigenous pre-service teachers entering into the professional certification year. I co-chaired Cariboo Curriculum working group to meet with all instructors in the Cariboo Field Centre to discuss course delivery and student supports. I also assisted with the transformation of EPSE 308, EPSE 311, and EDUC 440 into remote learning.
